Houston native Robert T. Gibson is a conductor, clinician, composer/arranger, lecturer, and educator who desires to develop future music educators for the next generation. His love and passion for music continues to leave lasting impressions on the students and singers he encounters. Gibson received a Bachelor of Music Education from the University of North Texas and a Masters in Music from Missouri State University. He has held secondary, collegiate, and church positions as well as served as guest clinician in Texas, Missouri, Pennsylvania, Kansas, Tennessee, and New York. Robert's choral compositions and arrangements can be found through Walton



Music and Alfred Publications. He is the 2020 recipient of the Missouri Choral Director Association Opus Award for his arrangement of "We Shall Overcome." He is a proud member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity Inc., Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and Phi Kappa Lambda National Music Honor Society. He is the proud husband to Amber Renae and father to Truly and Lovie.

JABARIE GLASS | Conducting Symposium Headliner



Jabarie Glass is the Associate Director of Choral Studies at the University of South Carolina School of Music. At USC, he conducts two choral ensembles, University Chorus and Gamecock Chorale (TTBB), and teaches undergraduate and graduate conducting and choral pedagogy courses. Glass's varied conducting experiences have included working with university, secondary, community youth, festival, and church ensembles. Choral organizations under his leadership have been selected to perform at the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) Southern Region Conference, the Mississippi-ACDA Conference, and the South Carolina Music Educators Association Conference.

As a conductor and collaborator, Glass is deeply committed to creating compelling concert experiences that speak to the

broadest range of human experiences. He has led choral-orchestral forces in performances of well-known historical works, including Requiem in D Minor, Op. 48 (Fauré); Elijah, Op. 70 (Mendelssohn); Requiem in D Minor, K 626 (Mozart); and Five Mystical Songs (Vaughan Williams), as well as galvanizing contemporary works such as Caroline Shaw's To the Hands. Additionally, he has prepared choruses for performances of notable works of the choral-orchestral repertory, including Carmina Burana (Orff), Symphony No. 2 in C Minor (Mahler), and Chichester Psalms (Bernstein).

Glass's scholarship focuses on conducting pedagogy, choral pedagogy, culturally responsive pedagogy, and music literacy. He has given guest lectures and presentations on these topics with university choral programs, at professional development workshops, and at national and regional conferences of the American Choral Directors Association. His article on the intersection of literature selection and choral pedagogy was published in the February 2021 issue of The Choral Journal.

Glass previously served as the founding conductor of CoroFuente, the tenor-bass chorus of CoroRio, a youth and adult community choral organization for which he currently serves on the board of directors, conductor of the Michigan Youth Chamber Singers, as well as Director of Choirs at Southaven High School and Middle School. As a dedicated advocate for student access to quality musical education, Glass is passionate about sharing the knowledge gained from his experience working with young musicians with current and future choral practitioners. Furthermore, he continues to invest in the musical growth of young choral artists through clinics with secondary choral programs and conducting honor choruses.

A native Mississippian, Glass earned a bachelor's degree in music education from the University of Mississippi. In 2005, he was named the Department of Music's Undergraduate Choral Music Education Student of the Year. In the same year, he was inducted into the University's Student Hall of Fame, a university-wide honor bestowed upon only ten seniors annually based on leadership, scholarship, service, and potential for success after graduation. Glass went on to earn a master's degree in music education from the Florida State University College of Music. He earned a doctoral degree in conducting from the University of Michigan School of Music, Theatre & Dance. He pursued additional conducting studies as a conducting fellow with the Chorus America Conducting Academy and the Yale-Norfolk Chamber Music Festival Choral Conducting Workshop.

RASHAAD CALAHAM | AR-ACDA Middle Level Honor Choir Clinician



Rashaad Calaham is the current Head Director of Choirs at Fossil Hill Middle School. Prior to teaching in Keller ISD, he was the Director of Choirs at Sam Houston Middle School for the Irving ISD for five years, and at Reed Middle School in Duncanville ISD for one year.

Choirs under his direction have received consistent sweepstakes ratings at UIL Concert & Sightreading Assessments. He has had a number of students earn placement in All-Region Choirs as well as the Texas Choral Directors Association Convention Middle School All-State Choir. During his time at Houston Middle School, the Varsity

Treble Choir was named an Invited Performing Choir for the 2021 Texas Music Education Association Convention. Rashaad held the title of 2021 Houston Middle School's *Teacher of the Year* as well as the 2021 *Secondary Teacher of the Year* for all of Irving ISD. He has also received the Mirabeau B. Lamar Award for Education by the Irving Masonic Lodge. His co-authored narrative inquiry research "*Sassy and Strong: Intersections of Sexuality and Race within Music Education*," has been featured at TMEA, NAfME National Conference, and the Journal of Research in Music Education (along with Dr. Don Taylor, professor of Music Education at the University of North Texas).

He received his Bachelor's degree from the University of Arkansas at Monticello, majoring in both Instrumental and Vocal Music Performance and received his Master's degree from the University of Texas at Arlington, where he studied Conducting.

Rashaad is also frequently asked to perform in various capacities in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex, including membership in the American Choral Prize-winning ensemble, Brothers in Song. Rashaad is a member of the Turtle Creek Chorale, where he serves as an Artistic Associate, as well as co-conducts the Chamber Chorus with his partner, Alex Carr. He also does chorus and guest solo work with many groups around the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex as a countertenor. He is also a specialist of multiple woodwinds, playing in many musical productions and ensembles around the city, including the Cathedral of Hope Sanctuary Orchestra.

RYAN SULLIVAN AR-ACDA Common Region Training Choir Clinician



Ryan W. Sullivan is the Director of Choral Activities, Coordinator of Vocal Studies, and Assistant Professor of Music at Arkansas State University. He conducts the flagship ensemble Concert Choir, Jonesboro Chorale, and Chamber Singers. He teaches coursework in conducting and music education, and serves as an advisor to students in all three of the university's undergraduate music degrees.


Prior to his time at A-State, Sullivan was the Associate Conductor for the Dallas Symphony Chorus and served as the conductor of Collegium Singers and Baroque Orchestra, the University of North Texas' early music ensembles. In 2018, he was awarded the Adams-Nordstrom Award for Early Music Studies. In addition to older works, Dr. Sullivan enjoys bringing new music to life, having conducted two North American opera premieres and world premieres of choral music by Robert Beaser, Derek Jenkins, James Eakin III, and Douglas

Helvering.

Sullivan has served as an invited conductor and clinician for choral festivals in Arizona, Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri, and Texas with additional upcoming engagements in Arkansas, Germany, and Portugal. His credits as a baritone soloist and in professional choral ensembles include the Santa Fe Desert Chorale, San Antonio Chamber Choir, The Cecilia Ensemble (GA), Spire Chamber Ensemble, Boston Early Music Festival, and Austin Baroque Orchestra. In Fall 2022, he will be a soloist in Las Vegas Sacred Music Series' performance of Charpentier's Messe de Minuit, H.9.

Sullivan serves as current Past-President for the Southwestern Region of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA). He was the 2014 recipient of the Prelude Award from Missouri ACDA. In 2023, he will be one of six American conductors to participate in ACDA's International Conducting Exchange Program with the German Choral Association. He holds a Doctor of Music Arts from the University of North Texas, a Master of Music from Texas Tech University, and undergraduate degrees in Music Education and Vocal Performance from the University of Missouri – Kansas City Conservatory of Music. His principal teachers have been Allen Hightower, Richard Bjella, Joshua Habermann (conducting), Vinson Cole and William Joyner (voice), and Brad Bennight (continuo harpsichord).

JOHN JACOBSON | Elementary Headliner



In October of 2001 President George Bush named John Jacobson a Point of Light award winner for his "dedication to providing young people involved in the arts opportunities to combine music, charitable giving and community service."
